C. W. Hueske Passes Away

Pioneer Of Dunn County
And A Valued Citizen
Is Gone

Carl William Hueske was born Oct. 23, 1889, in Germany. When he became of age he was united in marriage to Miss Augusta Krieger and to them were born ten children, six of whom are living. In 1892 they came to the United States and settled at Morgan, Minn., where his wife died one year later. In 1894 he and his children moved to Renville, Minn., and settled on a farm. Here he was married to Mrs. Bertha Zaske. In 1905 they moved to Stark County, N. D., and in 1906 to Dunn County and settled on the farm which is now the family home. On April 25, 1974, he passed away at the age of 85 years, 6 months and 2 days, leaving to mourn his wife, seven sons and six daughters. He was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church.

Funeral services were held out of doors at the home on Sunday afternoon, with a large crowd of sorrowing relatives and sympathizing friends present. Rev. Fred Kordewick, of Richardton, preached a very touching sermon on the Resurrection. Special music was rendered by a choir consisting of Wm. Mellow, Kenneth Garwick, E. E. Elliott and John Hanson, with Miss Melba Garwick as organist. Many and beautiful flowers were brought by friends. Interment was made in the Normanna Cemetery five miles southwest of Dunn Center.

One of Dunn County's pioneers has passed, one of our best citizens leaves a wide circle of friends who will miss his presence, a large family is left to mourn for a beloved husband and father.

OBITUARY

Carl Hueske, who died at the Werner depot April 25th, was born in Germany in 1852. He came to the United States in 1892, and settled in Renville county, Minnesota. In 1893, a year after arriving in this country, his wife died, and a year later he was married to Mrs. Bertha Zaske, of Olivia, Minn. In 1905 he moved to Stark county, ND, with his family, moving to Dunn county a year later, where he homesteaded on the farm where he has lived ever since. Besides his wife he leaves six children by his first marriage, Fred, of Richardton; August, of Werner, Carl, of Dunn Center; Mrs. Henry Neubauer, of St. Paul; Mrs. T.B. Thompson, of Dunn Center; and Mrs. John Klovstad, of Werner; three children by his second marriage, John, Martha and Esther, at home, and four step-children, Fred Zaske, of Richardton; Albert and Herman, of Dunn Center, and Mrs. Chet Moffit. 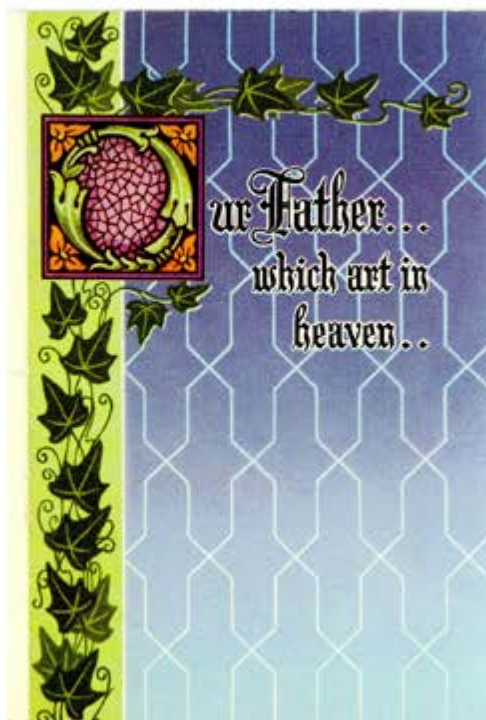

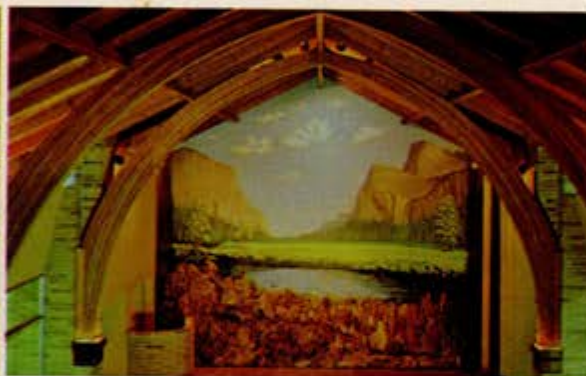
