## **FORSTER, Bernell A. "Barney"**

Barney was born in Richardton, ND on November 11, 1921 to Agatha and Adam Forster. He passed away on July 19 at home after a brief illness. The family moved to Auburn, WA in 1944 and then to Spokane in 1945. He married Marie Stroomer on August 7, 1946, settled in Spokane, and they had seven children. Barney was a skilled craftsman who built custom cabinets and his own homes. He loved fishing, camping, and gold panning with his family and friends, and always had a garden. Barney joined the Army Air Corps in May of 1942 and was a P-47 Thunderbolt fighter pilot in World War II. He served in the Mediterranean Theater of the 12th Air Force, fighting the Rome-Arno, Southern France, and North Italy areas. His fighter unit was the 350th Fighter Group, 347th Fighter Squadron, the famous "Screaming Red Ass" Squadron. Barney was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, European Middle Eastern Service Medal with three Bronze Stars, and his unit was awarded the Presidential Citation Award by President Harry S. Truman in 1945. Although Barney was reluctant to talk about his World War II combat experiences, his family acknowledged him as a member of the Greatest Generation and a war hero. Barney is survived by his wife of 61 years, Marie, whom he diligently cared for since her stroke in 1999; seven children and their spouses: Gerrie and Jim Walsh, Michael and Dorothy Forster, Patrick and Barbara Forster; Richard and Lav Forster, Elaine Forster and Jack Summers, Annie and Pat Weisbeck, and Mary and Dale Schrempp; 20 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren; two sisters and two brothers, numerous nieces and nephews. 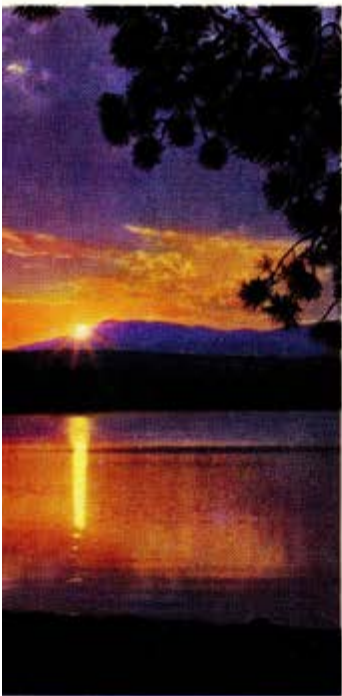

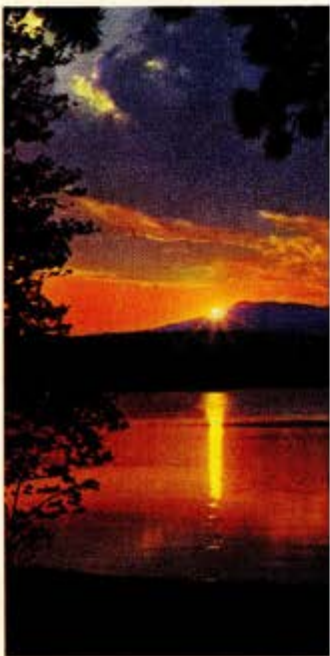

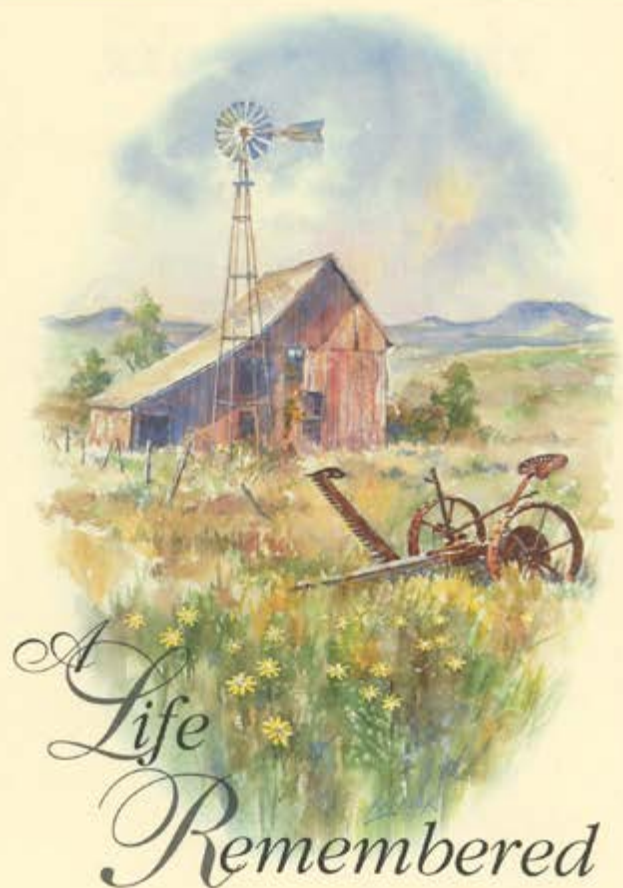
